Consultation feedback

Recent consultation activity has included:

Ageing Population Strategy

The strategy was approved by the Council Executive in September. Electronic copies can be located on the Council website. Hard copies are available from Andrew Lowing. Thank you to everyone who provided comments.

Budget Survey

Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour and Environmental Crime, Waste and Recycling, Street Cleaning and Litter Picking were identified as the most important services in

the Council's recent budget consultation.

The areas where residents wanted to reduce spending were Sports, Culture and Leisure, Planning / Economic Development and Parks and Open Spaces.

The Budget Survey asking residents to prioritise council services in terms of their importance and whether spending should be reduced or increased was published in the last two editions of Rochford District Matters and made available online on the Council's website. Copies of the survey were also distributed at various Council meetings and venues in order to get as many responses as possible. The Council received a total of 495 responses, 328 by post and 167 online.

Respondents were split over some services. For example:

- Support to the Community was deemed a high priority by 8.6% of respondents and a low priority by 8.1%.
- Public and Environmental Health was a high priority for 11.1% of respondents and a low priority for 6.7%.
- Support to the Voluntary Sector was a high priority for 8.8% of respondents and 9.9% thought

it was a low priority.

All age groups stated that 'Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour and Environmental Crime' was the highest priority service. As for the services that should see spending reductions the under 25's and the 25-49 age groups' choice was 'Planning / Economic Development' while the 50-64 and 65+ age groups opted for 'Sports, Culture and Leisure'.

The feedback from this consultation has been considered by Members during the budget process.

Communicating with Residents survey

This survey ran in August and September and asked residents to give their views on how the Council currently communicates with them and how they would like to be communicated with in the future. 18% of respondents currently think that the Council communicates very well with the majority 58% stating fairly well. Just over half of respondents, 51%, use the Council's website and Rochford District Matters (RDM) to find out about Council services, news and events. The local press and parish newsletters were also popular responses. In terms of communicating in the future, the website and RDM remained the top choices accounting for 51% of responses.
